Mayor Kim Holaway welcomed all present and asked everyone to introduce themselves.

ITEM #3: OPEN CALL TO THE PUBLIC

No item was discussed.

ITEM #4: CONSENT AGENDA

- A. Approval of Minutes of Eagar Town Centennial Park Committee Meeting held March 7, 2011.

Phelps Wilkins moved to approve the minutes of the Eagar Town Centennial Park Committee Meeting held March 7, 2011. Seconded by Becky Pacey and all were in favor. Vote 13-0

ITEM #5: UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- A. Discussion and Consideration of the Timelines for the Different Phases.

Bill Greenwood- phases 1 & 2 will blend together, but they need a deadline when concrete has to be done. Councilor Debbie Rogers said that Brian Burnham would donate time to finish concrete. They will contact Brian to find out what days he can work, so the concrete can be completed. A crew will be there to pour the concrete. Mayor Kim Holaway contacted White Mountain Ready Mix to get an estimate on the price of concrete and received a price quote from them. Need two other price quotes to be in agreement with the towns purchase policy. It will take two or three pours, just need the days Brian Burnham can work.

Steve Christensen- some concrete will be done first and then rest of prep work. Councilor Debbie Rogers asked when the extra drive into the area (before Bashas` turn in) would be redone with a curb? Bill Greenwood- said that could be done after the workday on May 21<sup>st</sup>.

Tony Chapman and Kyle Nuttall will work the weekends of May 7<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> on sprinkler and drip system. Other workers and Scouts will be there to help. Mayor Kim Holaway will see if Woodland will donate the use of a trencher. Phase 3 deadline is May 20<sup>th</sup>. Steve Christensen- the sidewalks will be mostly in and you don't want to mess them up when the sprinkler system is put in. Bill Greenwood- will use scrap pipe and put sleeves out a ways under the sidewalk for the sprinkler system. Steve Christensen and Phelps Wilkins will get together to discuss the sprinkler/drip system. Councilor Tim Rasmussen would like them to get together and mark where we are trenching with spray paint, so the scouts will know where to trench.

ITEM #6: NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion and consideration of Donations.

Vice Mayor James Nelson has been soliciting donations out at the power plant. He has one donation and we will deposit it in the White Mountain Historical Societies account, so that people can get a tax donation receipt.

Mayor Kim Holaway is working on a Bashas` donation to pay for one of the Kiosk. Does any one know of a bricklayer for the kiosk? Phelps Wilkins called the pavers brick company to see if they could make the family names bigger. Tony Chapman and Kyle Nuttall will be working on pavers and will be handling out forms and taking orders for the pavers.

Marion will look for catalogs for vintage lights. The town will probably buy one first to use as a pattern for the bolts in the concrete, before the new budget year and buy the others in the new budget year.

Bradley Nicoll- called a company in Snowflake – Cedar Ridge Sod and the cost savings was 25¢ per square foot and it averaged out to \$500.

Bradley Nicoll reported that the new railing was finished on the gazebo and they want to stain it first. Will talk to Councilor Steve Erhart about concrete tabletops. Nicoll family is donating the benches. Bill- NAVIT could do the metal legs for the tables, if it is a simple design. Also need metal brackets for the tabletop to set on. The tables need a logging flavor to it, as this was a logging town. Councilor Debbie Rogers asked Bradley Nicoll to have his Dad give a price for the wood picnic benches without the top. Also get a price for metal foundations.

B. Discussion and Consideration of the New Date for the Work Day, Saturday, May 21, 2011.

Bradley Nicoll- are we wanting to do a potluck or hotdogs? It was decided to do hotdogs. Councilor Debbie Rogers- put on flyers to bring something to go with them, like chips, dessert or salad. Bradley showed a flyer he had made asking people to bring the dessert or salad. Bradley will see if Bashas will donate the hotdogs, buns, and water. Councilor Rogers will make up igloos of Country Time Lemonade. Marion will check and see if State Farm will donate cups.

Time to start the Centennial Park Work Day will be 7:00 a.m. till 4:00 p.m. Deryl Jevons suggested having a table set up to sign in and clip boards for the papers. Mayor Kim Holaway will need the sign in sheets for her paper work.
