Making Improvements

Public Works would like to thank you for your patience during the many road closures on School Bus Road, S. Burk Street, and W. 10th Street during the installation of new culverts and repaving of these streets.

In September a chip seal project will be completed in the Cedar Ridge Subdivision (Aspen, Oak, Ponderosa and E. 1st Street). This fall, two mill and overlay projects are scheduled on School Bus Road from Main Street to SR 260 and N. Butler Street from Central to 5th Ave-

nue. An eight foot multi use path will also be installed from S. 2nd Street to N. 5th Avenue on Butler Street. Driver feedback signs will also be installed in the school zone on S. Main Street.

Two water line improvement projects will take place this fall on S. Burk Street from 4th Street to 6th Street and on W. 4th Street a 500 foot section between River Road and Burk Street.

During the construction of these projects be aware of work crews and equipment, obey all traffic con-



control signs and please slow down in the construction zones.

Very special thanks to all of the individuals, businesses and organizations that contributed funds to the National Fire Safety Council program on our behalf. This year's donations totaled \$3,120.00; these donations are used to purchase our prevention materials at a reduced price. These materials are handed out at the schools in Round Valley during Fire Prevention Week and we handout over 850 prevention packets every year to children between three and 12 years old.

On Halloween Saturday, October 31st our Fire Department members will setup in Bashas' parking lot for our Annual Community Halloween-Weenie Roast. Come and enjoy this wonderful time of year with us. We enjoy the opportunity to thank the community for all their support and hard work throughout the year, without which we would not be able to do the all things we do.

The summer's monsoon have left the valley and surrounding areas with a bumper crop of tall grasses and weeds. When these begin to cure the valley may be facing extreme fire conditions. Now is the time to be cleaning around your property, be fire

safe; clear the tall grasses and weeds away from all structures. Clean around your wood piles and have them at least 30 feet from any building. This is a lot of work, but it could save your home and property if we have a fast moving grass fire in the valley.

Requests for the Fire Department to conduct debris burns, right of way burns or field burns need to be made as soon as possible. The Fire Department must schedule these as time, weather, and manpower allows. We do our best to complete as many burn requests as we can. Requests can be obtained online or at the Fire Department. Our hours are Monday – Thursday 7:00 am to 5:00 pm and we are closed on Holidays. The Fire Department phone number is 333-4363; for all **Emergencies dial 911**; there is no one on duty to answer phones after hours so please leave a message and we will get back with you on the next business day.

Eligible repairs - Utility hookups, failing septic systems, roofing, inoperable heating equipment, accessibility improvements, electrical system repairs and major appliance replacement and many other items. Homeowners must qualify based on their income.
